Admission Test Syllabus to Class VI 2025
(Doc No : SyID- 07)

This is for the information of the parents that a few vacancies for admission to the Class arise occasionally. These are purely merit-based admissions.

Admissions to these vacancies are finalized on the basis of the results of the written examination in the subjects of English, Urdu, Mathematics, Science, and a subsequent interview. An oral test for Quran is conducted separately.

Syllabi for the written examination is given below:

ENGLISH:

Grammar: Singular/ Plural, Masculine and Feminine, Nouns (Proper, Common and Collective), Pronouns (Personal and Reflexive), Verbs (different forms of verb), Adverbs, Auxiliary Verbs, Adjectives, Words/Opposites. (Fill in the blanks, Match the columns, Identification, Underline the Correct Part of Speech, Correct use of Verb, Correct Subject and Verb Agreement etc.)

Composition: Descriptive Writing (e.g. My School, Quaid –e-Azam etc.) (about 80-100 words), **Letter** (Informal e.g. to friend/parents, sister/brother asking for some money etc.) / Write a short invitation

Application (Formal e.g. for character certificate etc.), **Story Writing** (Title/ Moral: A Foolish Stag/ All that glitters is not gold. etc.), Sentence Making, Spelling (missing letters), Reading Comprehension (Q/Ans, etc.),

Tenses (Translation from Urdu into English, Present, Past and Future Indefinite and Continuous)

MATHEMATICS:

Whole Numbers and Operations, HCF and LCM, Fractions, Decimals and Percentages, Distance and Time, Unitary Method, Geometry, Perimeter and Area, Data Handling.

SCIENCE:

Classification of Organisms, Five Kingdom System, Classification and Characteristics of Flowering Plants, Classification of Vertebrates, Classification of Invertebrates, Microorganisms, Main Groups of Microorganisms, Diseases Caused by Microorganism, Useful Role of Microorganisms in Everyday Life, Structure of Flower, Pollination and its Types, Structure of Seed, Germination of Seed, Environmental Pollution and its Types, Greenhouse Effect, Physical Changes in Matter, Processes Involved in Changes in States of Matter, Dissolving Substances in Water, Chemical Changes in Matter, Luminous and Non Luminous Objects, Transparent, Opaque and Translucent Objects, Reflection of Light, Sound, Speed of Sound in Different Materials, Intensity of Sound, Static Electricity, Charge, Types of Change, Properties of Charge, Electric Current, Electric Circuit and its Components, Conductors and Insulators, Structure of the Earth, Water Cycle, Satellite, Artificial Satellites, Importance of Artificial Satellites, Uses of Various Satellites, Plumb Line, First Aid
